


We will connect with EVERY Senior this Fall during SENIOR MEETINGS. During this time, we

- Tight schedule, designed for student only HAPPY to schedule another time to meet with parent/guardian!



Things to think about for GRADUATION!!

Each of the following are things qualifying seniors will be recognized for at graduation. For more information on each, be sure and visit the Registration link on the PHS Website, phs.haywood.k12.nc.us

Endorsements (Career, College, College UNC, NC Academic Scholar, Global Language) - also shared with students every year at grade level meetings

Merit Diploma (students whose rank is in the top ten percent of the graduating class, and who have a score on the SAT or the ACT which is higher than the "national average" for the previous year. A special seal will be affixed to the student's diploma).

Honors Cords - AP/College & Career Promise (4 AP Courses OR 8 CCP classes with 3.5 or higher GPA) Other cords: World Language Honor Student, NJROTC Honor Student, Fine Arts Honor Student, National Honor Society, Career and Technical Honor Student - check with teachers for criteria

Honors Graduate (based on grade as of 5th 6 weeks) - Summa Cum Laude (4.5 and ↑), Magna Cum Laude (4.25-4.499), and Cum Laude (4.0-4.2499)

Choosing to further your EDUCATON?

Not all schools offer the same majors, and not all jobs require the same level of education! Choose what's right for you!

What level of education is required for the field you plan to work in?

Can you do your dream job with a Certificate or Diploma from a Community College? These only take a semester or a year.

Does your career field require an Associate's Degree from a Community College? This takes 2 years if able to go full-time.

Does the career path you most desire require a Bachelor's Degree, a 4-year degree from a College or University? You could go directly to a 4-year school, or complete 2 years of general education at the community college and your last 2 years at the college or university.

Note: some career fields require additional education beyond a Bachelor's Degree. Some require a Master's Degree or even a Doctorate Degree, which means additional years of education. Be sure to research your career field in depth!


CACRAO College Fair @ WCU





Need a recommendation from your Counselor?

Some college or scholarship applications will require you to submit a letter of recommendation. If you get to choose your recommender, think carefully about who knows you best and who has the most and best things to say about you!

- Allow your recommender plenty of time to write your letter. They often have multiple students they are writing for. Don't rush the process!
- Provide any guidelines from the school/scholarship as to any specifics the letter should address
- If your application requires a Counselor Recommendation, please contact your counselor for a google form link for you to complete and schedule an appointment with your counselor well before the deadline after you complete the form!
- Always send a note of appreciation to anyone who writes a letter on your behalf.

TESTING

Should I take another ACT? Should I take the SAT?

- UNC System-still awaiting NC Board of Governors decision (end of May).
- NEW to apply for 2025 fall start: 2.5 minimum weighted GPA; or 19 ACT / 1010
 SAT for UNC System (raising admissions standards-1st phase)
- Look at College Comparison Chart (in folder)
- Registration online through the ACT/SAT websites (act.org & collegeboard.com
- ACT Cost \$55-70 (with writing); SAT \$60 (fee waivers available)
- Location choose location based on where offered on your chosen date
- Prep collegeboard (SAT), ACT, cfnc, Kaplan, etc. (free vs. cost)
- Some colleges offer additional scholarship money for higher scores; check with your top choices for more information!
